3. Practical questions on the placement

Type of accommodation: Dormitory room.
Monthly price: (Price in EUR monthly): 680 EUR.
Describe equipment, what to bringoptions for accommodation at halls of residence in evenings or over weekends ... Corridor rooms was furnished with a study desk, a chair, one bed, one bookshelf, wardrobe and lamps. I had to bring/buy my own quilt, pillow, sheets and towels. The common kitchen has refrigerator, freezer, stove and an oven. Basic dinnerware and cooking utensils were provided. Also, I was provided with your own kitchen cupboard with lock and refrigerator shelf. And finally, the laundry room is located on the main floor. A time booking sheet is located in the laundry room and the tenant is responsible for following the rules and regulations in the laundry room and to clean up after using the laundry facilities.
How and how far in advance is it necessary to arrange accommodation? 3 months before the departure.
What are the options for catering? Primate apartments or dormitory.
What are the rough costs of groceries – compare with Czech prices 3-4 times more expensive than in the Czech Republic.
Means of transport to location of placement: Approximate price: 55 euros student monthly ticket for public transportation services. Tips for purchase of cheap tickets/further recommendations: /
